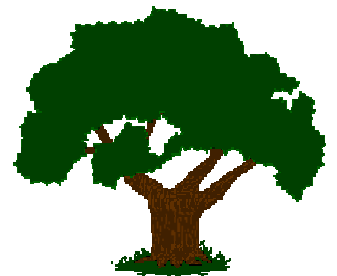

Federation Chief Jim "Mighty Oak" Erker, award namesake Tim "Golden Oak" Pasternak, and the Rocky Mountain leadership came together to surprise Kevin prior to the expedition's graduation ceremony. The ceremony surprises included Kevin's wife, Janie, and daughter Michaela (Princess Wild Kitty, 2008 Yellowstone Expedition/Mallard Tribe grad) making the 230 mile round trip journey to celebrate Kevin's contributions to the program. Kevin's children both read letters they wrote to their father which left many reaching to wipe a tear from hearing such heartfelt words. The tears turned to laughter with some funny but sincere testimonials from Federation members, present and past, extolling the contributions Howling Moon has made to the program.

The Golden Oak Award is the Lake Prairie Federation's highest honor. The purpose of the Lake Prairie Federation's Golden Oak Award is to recognize those individuals who, through their numerous personal sacrifices and exhaustive commitment to the program, have single-handedly made a significant and undeniably positive difference in the quality and function of the Lake Prairie Federation. 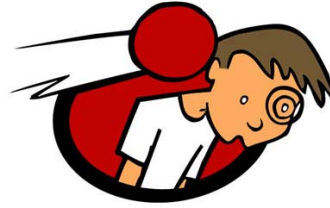

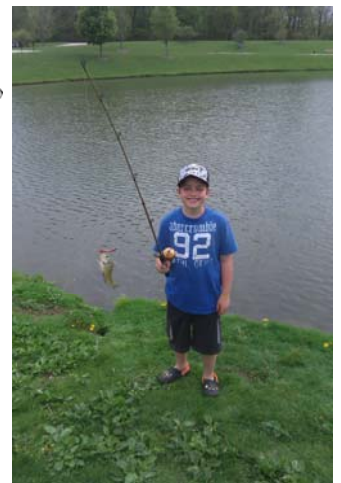

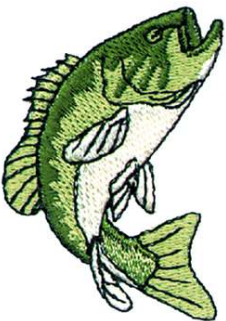
So how was Wolf Park???
